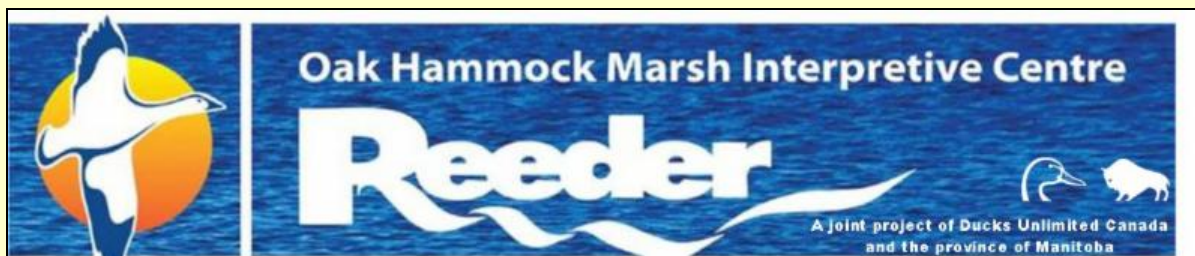

Wildlife Management Area Van Tour

July 12 and 26

Oak Hammock Marsh is a 3,600 hectare (9000 acre) Wildlife Management Area that features a restored prairie marsh, aspen-oak bluff, waterfowl lure crops, artesian springs, some of Manitoba's last remaining patches of tall-grass prairie and 30 kilometers of trails to explore.



It is home to 25 species of mammals, 300 species of birds, numerous amphibians, reptiles, and fish, and countless invertebrates.

The vast majority of our visitors only see a very small fraction of this wonderful wetland as some of the most remote area are not as easily accessible.

Explore some of these remote areas with an experienced guide on July 12 and 26 as we take visitors on an exclusive tour of the Wildlife Management Area in the Oak Hammock Marsh Interpretive Centre van.

This special tour is only **\$10 plus admission**. Sign up early as space is very limited.
