Program Details

Animal Teachers

Through a sharing circle and interactive activities, discover how animals can be great teachers! Learn the importance of various wetland animals to Indigenous cultures.

Beavers & Muskrats

Learn about adaptations and special characteristics of beavers and muskrats that allow them to live in wetlands.

Explore Watersheds

Through a demonstration model and various activities and games, students learn the importance of wetlands and watersheds.

Geocaching *

Learn the basics of how GPS Geocaching is a fun way to practice using a GPS, which is an important tool used by wildlife researchers in the field.

Bird Beaks & Feet

Wetland birds use their beaks and feet to eat, hunt, swim, and walk, but different kinds of birds have different needs, so their beaks and feet are shaped differently.

Birding 101

Learn about the fascinating diversity of birds found at Oak Hammock Marsh with this introduction to bird identification.

Indigenous Games

Engage in fun, interactive, and challenging games that teach important skills and lessons. These games were and still are played by Indigenous groups in the area.

Invertebrate Sampling

Grab a bucket and dip net, or even a dredge, to sample the waters, discovering the diversity of life. Strap on some chest waders to get an even closer look (water levels permitting).

Critter Dipping

Head out onto the dock with a bucket and dip net to search for life under the water. Learn about the diversity of creatures we can find in the marsh, then use magnifiers to identify your critters.

Ecology Games

Learn about animal behaviours and interactions by playing high-energy, interactive games. Can be played inside, weather permitting.

Itsy-Bitsy Spider

What are spiders, and how are they different from other "bugs"? Spiders are important animals in our environment. They aren't scary, they're cool!

Reptiles & Amphibians

Explore the similarities and differences between these two vertebrate groups. Find out why wetlands play such an important role, in these sensitive creatures' lives.

Super Soils

Learn about the properties of soil and the animals that call it home by moving through interactive stations.

Voyageur Canoe *
